A 3.0 GPA is required. Those selected will be invited to attend a special Scholars Seminar and Recognition Luncheon at Ashland University on March 3, 2007. Parents also will be invited to attend. DISCOVER CARD TRIBUTE AWARD SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM (11)

Juniors with a minimum 2.75 GPA who demonstrate leadership, are actively contributing to their communities and have experienced and overcome a significant obstacle in their lives are eligible. POST SECONDARY ENROLLMENT OPTION MEETING (9,10,11)

Shelby High School and Pioneer Career and Technology Center students may take college courses (generally at OSU-Mansfield or NCSC) for college credit and high school credit. Students must meet admission requirements of the college. A mandatory (by state regulations) meeting for students and parents who wish to pursue this option will be held on Monday, February 26 at 7 P.M. in the Dave Jones Little Theater. Representatives from OSU-Mansfield and NCSC will also be present. This meeting will last less than thirty minutes.

JANUARY 17th FINANCIAL AID MEETING (11,12)

Mr. Lawrence Matthews, Director of Financial Aid at Bluffton University, will present financial aid information for parents and students at Shelby High School on Wednesday, January 17 at 7:00PM in the Dave Jones Little Theater. The first part of his program deals with general financial aid issues. The second part of the program deals specifically with the FAFSA form. While the program is of particular interest to parents of seniors, the information presented in the first part of the program can be helpful to anyone approaching this issue.

THE WILLIAM D. SQUIRES EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

This \$3,000 scholarship is renewable up to four years for a total of \$12,000. The scholarship is primarily need-based and only for students from Ohio. Applicants must have an EFC of less than \$10,000. Although this is not an academic scholarship, a minimum of a 3.2 GPA is required. THE OHIO STATE ALUMNI CLUB OF RICHLAND COUNTY SCHOLARSHIP

NORTH CENTRAL STATE UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Those students intending to attend NCSC and have a GPA of 2.5 qualify. Applicants must file the FAFSA form. Applications are available in the guidance office. Deadline is March 1, 2007.

THE MCKELVEY FOUNDATION ENTREPRENEURIAL SCHOLARSHIP

KFC SCHOLARS PROGRAM

Six non-renewable \$500 Leadership and Service Scholarships for graduating seniors starting college next fall at an Ohio college/university are available. THE WINNERS CLUB SCHOLARSHIP FUND

This scholarship is awarded on the basis of financial need, academic merit, and extra curricular activities. Student must be pursuing a degree in the field of education and have a minimum GPA of 3.5. MONSANTO COMMITMENT TO AGRICULTURE SCHOLARSHIP

AMERICAN MUNICIPAL POWER SCHOLARSHIPS

These \$1,500 scholarships are open to a student who lives in a household that receives electricity from the City of Shelby or lives with a parent who is employed by the city of Shelby. Students must have a 3.0 GPA. Part of the judging will be based on knowledge of public power. See Mr. Grady by Friday, January 12 if you are interested in this scholarship.
