**COMMUNITY**

The Shelby School District serves the city of Shelby (pop. 9,600) and the surrounding rural area in northwestern Richland County, Ohio. Agriculture and small industry are significant factors in the local economy.

**CURRICULUM**

Shelby High School has a varied curriculum to serve the diverse needs of our students. Thirty-six percent of Shelby students receive free or reduced lunches. Advanced classes are offered in all college preparatory areas; some of which are designated as honors courses. Shelby High School operates on a 4X4-block schedule, allowing students to take more than one course in subject areas each year. A number of Shelby students earn college credit through the post-secondary enrollment option program. Approximately 35% of our students in grades 11 and 12 are enrolled in career/technical programs through Pioneer Career and Technology Center.

**GRADING POLICIES:** Beginning in the 2009-2010 academic year, Shelby High School teachers are required to use the unified grading scale: (minimum percentage for each grade) A-90%, B-80%, C-70%, D-60%. Previous to this school year, each individual teacher could utilize their own grading scale. Final grades for semester courses, as indicated on the transcript, are the average of each nine-week grade (40% each) and the final exam grade (20%).

**Grade point averages and class rank** are based on a 4.0 scale; however, certain upper level courses in English, mathematics, social studies and science are weighted by adding .05 to the un-weighted cumulative GPA. Weighted courses are indicated by “\*\*” on the transcript.
