

Shelby Senior High School Phase 2 Scholarships

Due by 3pm on Thursday, March 14, 2019, in the SHS guidance office.

Exceptions: Richland County Foundation apps due April 1 (Ashley Yetzer Memorial), 'Imhoff' due March 1 via Columbus Foundation, and 'Paxton' due March 15 via Ashland County Community Foundation

1. **Read** the listing of local scholarships and determine the scholarships for which you qualify based on the CRITERIA column.

If you turn in an application for a scholarship whose criteria includes a specific college major and you change your major, you must tell Mrs. Lerback as soon as possible. *The embarrassment for EVERYONE when a student receives, for example, a business field-related scholarship when it's well-known that the student changed their mind to become a teacher, is AWKWARD.*

2. Scholarships are listed alphabetically, and by last name if the scholarship is named after a person.

STANDARD applications are available on the SHS Guidance Office website *Standard Application for Local Scholarships* link.

Print your essay and attach it to each standard application that you submit. Select 'portrait' before printing the app!

*Use your **six-semester GPA** and **six-semester class rank** for Phase 2 scholarships.

SPECIFIC applications are on the table outside the guidance office. Complete these neatly and legibly in **blue or black pen**.

ONLINE a few Phase 2 applications are entirely online and are marked as such.

3. **Some scholarships require supporting materials.** These are listed in the far right column '**extra materials needed**' such as:

- **essays**
- **letters of recommendation**
(give the recommender at least 10 days notice before expecting a complete letter)
- **transcript** ... there is a *Transcript for Scholarships request sheet* in the Guidance Office
- **SAR** (Student Aid Report, obtained by completing FAFSA)
- **photo**
- **an interview**, if selected

4. **Optional: Please submit copies of any award letters you receive from colleges to Mrs. Barker.** These should include a breakdown of your financial aid package (which outlines grants, scholarships, loans, and expected net cost to you to attend that school). By sharing your award letters, you understand that this information could be shared with scholarship committees IF they ask for it.

5. **Return all paper materials to the SHS Guidance Office by 3pm on Thursday, March 14, 2019.**

It will save you time to alphabetize your applications prior to turning them in. Each scholarship has its own bin or folder.

It is YOUR responsibility to turn in the required materials with each application.

Staple your materials together for each separate scholarship.
